Treaty Education Professional Development

Treaty Education refers to the development and implementation of a greater understanding of the inherent aboriginal rights of the Mi'kmaq and the shared treaties as both historical and living agreements that articulate ongoing rights and responsibilities and have ongoing implications. On April 17, 18 and 20, 2023, all Grades 3 and 4 teachers received Treaty Education professional development including participation in the Blanket Exercise. The Blanket Exercise is an interactive educational program that teaches the history of colonization in Canada. The program was created in response to the 1996 report of the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples and is used as a teaching tool across Canada.

I would like to thank SRCE Coordinator of Mi'kmaw Education Services, Miranda Gould, and Coordinator of Literacy, Tanya Carter, for organizing this excellent professional learning opportunity.




Canadian Mental Health week is May 1 to 7, 2023. As a reminder, for our children, youth and families needing support, please note the following resources:
